
CDA Conference Leeds October 2025

Summer Deaflympics - Tokyo 15th November - 26th November 2025

International multi-sport events for Deaf athletes held every 4 years, the event is organised by the International Committee of sports for the Deaf (ICSD) the games use visual signals instead of auditory cues, such as flashing lights for the starting signals. It is the world's longest running multi-sport event for Deaf people and it is organised by Deaf people, for Deaf people (overseen by ICSD)

The first Deaflympics were held in Paris, France in 1924, so that makes them the second oldest multi-sport and cultural festival in the world!!

The games were originally known as the "International Silent Games" featuring 148 athletes from 9 European Nations.

This year there were around 2,500 Athletes from 78 nations taking part!

There were 21 sports on the programme, including athletics, football and golf. Team GB had 65 athletes competing (along with 35 supporting staff) the team competed in Athletics, cycling, football, golf, shooting, swimming and tennis.






Make Your Own Christmas Wreath

Lots of styles you can make and it will add that personal touch that store-bought versions simply can't match. Here is one idea for a traditional one, but you can add whatever you like to it. Also have a look for ideas online.

- To start, you will need some florist/garden wire and a wreath frame, you can buy from many shops, online or from florists—you don't have to spend a lot. You can use fresh evergreen and/or holly if you have them in your garden. You can also use plastic ones, these work just as well. Whichever you choose, use the wire to attach the greenery to your wreath frame.
- You can then go 'wild' with flowers or berries or cones (plastic are fine but if you have fresh in your garden then why not use them) Use hot glue or wire to attach your decorations around the wreath in clusters. You can also use Christmas baubles and tinsel if you want to.
- You can buy some lights (ones with timer are best so as not to waste battery, they aren't
 expensive either) Wind the lights between your decorations and make sure you hide the battery
 pack as best you can (also put it in plastic bag/clingfilm to protect it from rain etc).
- Add a ribbon bow at the bottom—this one is plain but you could use any bow ribbon you like to match your theme
- If you use fresh greenery make sure to spray with water weekly to keep fresh
- · Hang with a wreath hanger or ribbon and there you are!

Everyone will love it and yours will be unique, much better than a shop bought one. So why not have a go and enjoy being creative

Obituary - Joseph Mulligan

We received sad new that we lost a Deaf member from our Liverpool Diocese, Joe (Joseph) Mulligan passed away on 16th October 2025 at the age of 87.



Joe was born in St Helens on 10th May 1938. He attended Boston Spa Deaf school in Yorkshire and he enjoyed being there, he felt it became his second home. After school, he started working as a carpenter, a job he enjoyed.

He attended St Helens Deaf centre and this is where he met his beloved late wife Marie. Joe enjoyed playing darts and playing pool/snooker and chatting with his friends.

Joe also loved to go to Liverpool Deaf centre where he was always winning Bingo! He used to go to over 55's club, he was a member of both the Deaf church in St Helens and MSDP. Joe was so proud to be involved in Eucharistic Ministry and he became a Minister in 1999. Joe regularly attended St Bartholomew's Roman Catholic church where Fr Philip Swanson led the mass, he also attended Mass at St Austin's parish in Thatto Heath.

Joe was respected member of the Deaf Advisory committee. Joe leaves behind his 2 children and 3 grandchildren; but now he is reunited with his late wife Marie. Joe will be missed by our Deaf community, Rest in Peace.
